Professor Athanassios G. Platias after having received his Ph.D. from Cornell University taught for almost 35 years at the Departments of International and European Studies, University of Piraeus and Panteion University. A renowned international strategist and author who advises Organisations and Institutions globally in the fields of Geopolitics and Geoeconomics, International Security, International Relations and Defence Policy. In the past he has served as a Ford Foundation Fellow at Harvard University as well as a MacArthur Fellow in International Peace and Security at MIT and Harvard University. He is currently the president of the Council for International Relations-Greece.

Konstantina E. Botsiou is a Professor of History and International Relations at the University of Piraeus, Visiting Professor at the Hellenic National Defense College, and General Director of the Council for International Relations-Greece (CfIR). She has taught at the Department of Political Science and Public Administration, University of Athens, and at the Department of Political Science and International Relations, University of the Peloponnese. She has been a research fellow at LSE IDEAS, the Wilfried Martens Centre for European Studies and the Jean Monnet European Center of Excellence (Athens and Tübingen). She was also General Director and Vice President at the Konstantinos Karamanlis Institute for Democracy. Dr. Botsiou holds a PhD from the University of Tübingen.
